Railroad Earth Announces Acoustic Thanksgiving Performance

Andover, N.J. – National touring act Railroad Earth and WNTI-FM have announced that the band will play a special all-ages acoustic-only performance Saturday, Nov. 26 in the band's home state of New Jersey.

"An Acoustic Evening with Railroad Earth," will take place at 9 p.m. at Whitney Chapel, located at Centenary College in Hackettstown. The Chapel is the site of an acoustic recording made in 2000 by Railroad Earth lead singer and guitarist Todd Sheaffer, which later turned into the critically acclaimed album, "Dream of Love."

Railroad Earth's management feels the setting of Whitney Chapel will provide an appropriate backdrop to a rare acoustic performance.

"This performance will give us a chance to explore a different sound, and Whitney Chapel is the perfect place to do that," says Railroad Earth's management.

This one-night only acoustic performance is just one of the treats the sextet has in store for fans in upcoming months. An early December four-night tour with Honkytonk Homeslice (Bill Nershi, String Cheese Incident) and a recently announced New Year's Even run with stops in Falls Church, VA and the Theatre of Living Arts (TLA) in Philadelphia are also on the schedule, as is the band's first live album, slated for release on SCI Fidelity Records in early 2006.
